

01. Abstract

The following report is based on the activities done by Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery, Kerala, India, in response to COVID-19 pandemic during the period 2020-2021 in association with the support of Local Self Governments, Ernakulam District Administration, Labour Department, Tribal, Revenue and Health Departments of Government of Kerala, NITI Aayog, Government of India, State and District Level Inter-Agency Groups, Kerala State Disaster Management Authority & Ernakulam District Disaster Management Cell, Government of Kerala ITC Rural Trust Development – Kolkata, Corporates, and Staff, Students & Alumni of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences & Rajagiri outREACH.

02. Introduction

ABOUT COVID-19

Corona virus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered corona virus. As per WHO, most people infected with the virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment. Older people and those with underlying medical problems like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease and cancer are more likely to develop serious illness.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19?


According to the World Health Organization, it is possible to carry COVID-19 for anything from 48 hours to 14 days, prior to any symptoms becoming noticeable.

New discoveries about the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 are being made on a daily basis, which is why it is essential to keep up with the latest information from the WHO, CDC, NHS and so on. The most common indicative symptoms of COVID-19 are as follows:

- > A high temperature A new continuous cough
- Shortness of breath

Some patients have also reported the following symptoms, following their COVID-19 diagnosis: However, no specific combination of any of the above symptoms confirms a case of COVID-19.

- ➢ Sore throat
- Runny nose
- ➢ Nasal congestion
- \blacktriangleright Loss of taste or smell
- Aches and pains
- Diarrhea
- Chronic fatigue



In India, the COVID-19 pandemic was reported during the month of February 2020 and this virus affected many people's health, livelihood and day to day life. This COVID-19 pandemic caused anxieties, unemployment, isolation, lack of social interaction, lack of recreation and entertainment, loss of business, reduction in income, restrictions in movements and COVID-19 related health issues, etc. The livelihood of the people also came to a standstill due to the lockdown.

India with a population of over 1.3 billion is under tremendous threat with COVID-19 pandemic and as a proactive measure, the Government of India had declared for a Lockdown for 21 days from March 23, 2020. The Government of India had taken precautionary measures to control the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Kerala, the southernmost state of India is one of the first and majority affected States in India due to a large flow of international and national population. The State of Kerala has taken substantial measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and the same has been appreciated globally. However, the densely populated State is prone to high risk and is more so for its millions of Guest Workers / migrant labourers. Ernakulam District has the largest population of Guest Workers in the State of Kerala, with major concentration in Perumbavoor and Kalamassery region and the living condition has been observed as high risk during the lockdown period. Awareness, safe shelter, nutritious food, medical care, health and sanitization, prevention from drug/other abuse and mental health of the Guest Workers have emerged as significant areas of attention.

03. Highlights of Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences in response to COVID-19 during the period 1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021

During this pandemic situation, the role of Social Work Academic Institutions and NGOs were very important in providing psycho-social support, tele-counselling and distribution of health and provision of kits, etc. The Management, Rajagiri outREACH Staff, Faculty, Non-teaching Staff, Alumni, Students, NSS Volunteers of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, had jointly taken initiative as a team to serve the needy people and the community as a whole during the COVID-19 pandemic situation.

In Kerala the pandemic situation turned worse and that affected all the people. During lockdown period, the Guest Workers (migrants) faced lot of troubles such as anxiety about losing their jobs, scarcity of food and medications, baby food and the anxiety about COVID-19 itself and their desire to go back to their home state. Rajagiri outREACH, had reached out to them through the Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project of Kerala State AIDS Control Society, Government of Kerala and also with the support of District Administration, Ernakulum, Health Department, Labour Department, Local Self Governments and ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata.

During the COVID-19 lockdown period, from March 23, 2020 to May 2020, implemented by the Government of India and Government of Kerala, Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences under the leadership team, Dr. Fr. Jose Kuriedath CMI, Provincial, Rev. Dr. Mathew Vattathara CMI - Director, Rev. Dr. Saju M D CMI – Associate Director & Vice Principal, Dr. Binoy Joseph - Principal, Rev. Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI – Assistant Director, Rev. Fr. Rintle Mathew CMI - Administrator, Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla – Project Director, for their guidance and active involvement from inception to completion by undertaking safe measures and engaging in various activities providing assistance to the needy and struggling community with the timely assistance from sponsors, well-wishers, individuals, staff, students and alumni. The Civic Virtue and the Volunteering exhibited by the Staff of Rajagiri outREACH and Faculty, Non-Teaching Staff and Students of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was top notch at each and every phase of the project.


In response to COVID-19 pandemic, Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) had distributed 2679 Food and Health Provision Kits in 1 Corporation, 5 Municipalities, and 15 Panchayats of Ernakulam District. These kits were distributed with the support of Local Self Governments, District Administration, Labour Department, Tribal, Revenue and Health Department. The Representatives of these Government Bodies and Rajagiri College of Social Sciences were also present during the distribution. The Food items include Rice. Whole wheat Atta, Biscuit, Chilly Powder, Coriander Powder, Liberty Sunflower Oil, Salt, Dal, Tea Powder, Sugar, Big Onions, Potatoes and Health Provision, COVID-19 Relief Kits (including Sanitizer, Soaps, Masks, Hindi Pamphlet on prevention of COVID-19). The food and Health Provision Kits were distributed to 2000 Guest Workers / Migrants residing in Ernakulam District and Lactogen & Cerelac were distributed to the children of 121 families of Guest Workers / Migrants with the support of ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata. Rajagiri Collegeof Social Sciences, Kalamassery in association with Rajagiri outREACH distributed Food and Health Provision Kits to 65 students' families (from poor socio economic background) of Girls High School, Ernakulam, 100 tribal families of Kuttampuzha Tribal Development Project, 110 needy Staff of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, 45 HIV Affected & Infected Families, 133 Auto rickshaw drivers from the neighbourhood of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, 6 families from poor background at Vallarpadam, Ernakulam District and 220 Fishermen families of Chellanam (requested by the District Collector of Ernakulam District).

100000 masks were purchased and distributed by Rajagiri College of Social Sciences with the support of Rajagiri outREACH and other live labs, to the public during lockdown for the prevention of COVID-19 infection. The distribution took place in neighbourhood residents of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (main gate cabin), neighbourhood ration shop, migrants, fishermen, students' from poor socio economic families, tribal families, auto rickshaw drivers, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences needy Staff, HIV infected and affected families, Elderly citizens. In association with Malayala Manorama daily, 92000 masks were distributed on July 05, 2020 through newspaper agents to Perumbavoor, Kolencherry, Kothamangalam, Muvattupuzha, Pothanikad, Kuttampuzha, Njarackal, Vypin, etc. The masks and provision kits were also distributed as part of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences Unnat Bharat Abhiyan implementing projects at Vazhakulam and Keezhamadu Panchayats.

1000 books, 800 pens and 9 TVs were distributed by Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, to the Kuttampuzha Panchayat tribal students referred by Tribal Development Department, Ernakulam. Study materials like **Note Books and Furniture** (Cot,

Table & Chairs) were distributed to **12 children** under Child Sponsorship Scheme. **150 Saplings** were distributed to the sponsorship students and Kalamassery community people as part of observation of Environment Day and encourage the students to develop the skills on agriculture during COVID-19 period. During lock down period the Rajagiri outREACH Day Care Centre for Senior Citizens were closed so **102 nutrition kits and masks** including vegetables, rice and pulses were distributed to Senior Citizens' Day Care Centre at Kothad & Kadamakudy, Ernakulam District. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Rajagiri outREACH with the support of Rotary Club Kalamassery had shortlisted 90 needy women of Ernakulam District and distributed **sewing machines** during the COVID-19 lockdown period to overcome their financial crisis through stitching of masks. Rajagiri outREACH in association with Fragomen and ARPAN Foundation had distributed **8 Laptops and 1 mobile phone** to the needy children of underprivileged families for attending online classes. Rajagiri outREACH Staff and internship students in association with District Medical Office, Ernakulam, Kalamassery PHC and Rotary Club Kalamassery had volunteered their services during the COVID-19 vaccination in the month of March 2021.

04. Objectives of Rajagiri outREACH COVID-19 Relief Activities

- To identify the needy Families, Communities, Guest Workers in Ernakulam District, Kerala State, who are facing difficulties to meet their basic food and health requirements during COVID-19 period.
- To create linkages and build rapport by Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Project Staff, with the concerned District Administration, Local Self Government, Labour Department, Health Department for providing support, and identifying the requirements of the needy families, Communities and Guest Workers.
- To provide psycho-social support and counselling through telephone and house visits to avoid anxieties about the jobs and welfare of needy Families, Communities and Guest Workers.
- To spread awareness on prevention of COVID-19 to the needy families, communities and by distributing pamphlets in Hindi language and also awareness classes to the Guest Workers in their own language were given
- To meet the requirements of the needy Families, Communities and Guest Workers those who are facing financial constraints.
- To nourish the children of Guest Workers below 5 years by providing them with nutritious baby food
- To support the Guest Workers in obtaining Health Certificate from the Health Department and conducted HIV test in the camp with the support of Kerala State AIDS Control Society
- To assist the Guest Workers those who were eager to return back to their home state, for getting the necessary pass from the Government
- Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Project Staff supported the Labour Department for data updating of Guest Workers
- > The final aim is to stop transmission and prevent the spread of the virus in order to save lives by:
 - Protecting vulnerable people
 - Protecting people most at risk
 - No profiteering
 - Promotion of personal hygiene with focus on hand washing with soap and other related behaviour to break transmission of COVID-19 as per WHO guidance.
 - School based orientations and awareness campaigns
 - Coordinates with national authorities, partners in India and Overseas, to implement COVID-19 response actions targeting the most vulnerable people and hard-to-reach communities;
 - Raise public awareness on COVID-19 risks and mitigation measures to protect communities and health workers;

05. Methodology followed by Rajagiri outREACH for COVID-19 Relief Activities

IDENTIFICATION OF NEEDY FAMILIES INCLUDING GUEST WORKERS

Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Staff and other Staff had conducted house visits and telephonic counselling to identify the needy families including Guest Workers, who were in dire need of food and provisions during the COVID-19 lockdown period with the support of concerned Ward Member / Councillor of the Local Self Government, Labour Department, Revenue Department, Health Department and Kerala State AIDS Control Society in Ernakulam District, Kerala State.

PLANNING MEETING BY THE MANAGEMENT TEAM OF RCSS & RAJAGIRI outREACH

A Managing Committee Meeting was held on **02.05.2020** to plan the implementation of the Project "Enduring Values in Covid-19 Lockdown Food and Health Provisions to Needy Families including Guest Workers in Ernakulam District, Kerala".

During the meeting it was unanimously decided to place orders for the provisions. It was also decided to give provisions and corona care kits to the needy families including Guest Workers residing in Ernakulam District. Each kit was worth Rs.1000/-. During the ManagementCommittee it was also decided to purchase the products.







06. COVID-19 RELIEF ACTIVITIES OF RAJAGIRI outREACH FOR MIGRANTS / GUEST WORKERS

During the COVID-19 lockdown period, the migrants faced lots of issues such as anxiety about losing their job, scarcity to get food and medicines, baby food and anxiety about COVID-19 disease, and their desire to go back to their home State. Rajagiri outREACH in association with Rajagiri College of Social Sciences reached to the migrants through the Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project of Kerala State AIDS Control Society, Government of Kerala and also with the support of District Administration, Health Department, Labour Department, and Local Self Governments. In Ernakulam District, where the Rajagiri College is located, the migrants are thickly populated and during the COVID-19 lockdown period, with the support of Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, had got an opportunity to support **14489 migrants** by way of giving awareness classes on "Prevention of COVID-19 and HIV & STI, distributing Food and Health Provision Kits, Masks, Hindi Pamphlet on prevention of COVID-19, Baby Food, Support for HIV patients, psycho social support, facilitated in obtaining Fitness certificate of migrants to return back to their home state, with the support of Karumaloor Panchayat and Primary Health Centre, Tele counseling was given in association with Disha - the Toll Free Number of Health Department, Government of Kerala, Food Distribution with the support of Labour Department and linked the needy migrants residing in remote areas to Community Kitchen of Local Self Government - took initiative to identify needy migrants those who are facing severe crisis in getting food during lockdown due to lack of job. Rajagiri outREACH Staff also supported the Labour Department in collecting data of migrants in Ernakulam District

- Supported the Guest Workers in obtaining Health Certificate from the Health Department and conducted HIV test in the camp with the support of Kerala State AIDS Control Society.
- Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Project Staff supported the Labour Department for data updation of Guest Workers.
- Assisted the Guest Workers those who were eager to return back to their home state, for getting the necessary pass from the Government.
- Identified the needy Guest Workers families in Ernakulam District, Kerala State, who were facing difficulties to meet their basic food and health requirements.
- Rajagiri outREACH and Rajagiri College of Social Sciences distributed 2000 Food and Health Provisions kits to the Guest Workers in Ernakulam District with the support of ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata.
- Established linkages and build rapport with the concerned District Administration, Local Self Government, Labour Department, and Health Department for providing support, and identifying the requirements of the Guest Workers during Pandemic period.
- Met the requirements of the Guest Workers those who faced financial constraints to nourish their children below 5 years by providing 121 families with nutritious baby food (viz., Lactogen and Cerelac).

• Conducted awareness programs in various places on prevention of COVID-19 among migrants in their language, Hindi pamphlets were distributed and also road announcements were made through mikes fitted on vehicles.

DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND HEALTH PROVISION KITS DURING COVID-19 LOCKDOWN PERIOD TO 2000 GUEST WORKERS

Rajagiri outREACH in collaboration with ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata had distributed Food and Health Provision Kits to 2000 Guest Workers in Ernakulam District. ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata, had expressed interest to partner with Rajagiri outREACH to rehabilitate and to ensure safety and health of migrant labourers in the high risk Colonies of Perumbavoor and Kalamassery in Ernakulam District. With the experience of implementing Suraksha project in the region, Rajagiri outREACH has submitted a proposal to ITC Limited and ITC Rural Development Trust had awarded the project vide **Agreement dated April 17, 2020**, for **"Rehabilitation and Providing Safe/Healthy Environment for Migrant Workers in Ernakulam District, Kerala during Lockdown due to Covid-19 Pandemic"**.

With the Support of District Administration, Labour Department, Local Self Government, Health Department, Revenue Department, Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences distributed **2000 Food and Health Provision Kits to 1 Corporation 5 Municipalities and 13 Panchayats in Ernakulam District during May 2020** with the support of ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata.



AWARENESS PROGRAMMES ON PREVENTION OF COVID-19 AMONG MIGRANTS

COVID-19 was declared a "pandemic" by the World Health Organization (WHO) in early March 2020. Globally, extraordinary measures were being adopted to combat the formidable spread of the on-going outbreak. Under such conditions, people's adherence to preventive measures is greatly affected by their awareness of the disease. As the global threat of COVID-19 continues to emerge, it is critical to improve the awareness and preparedness of the targeted community members, especially the less educated migrants. Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project, Perumbavoor in collaboration with the Health Department and the Labour Department, has been instrumental in promoting corona awareness among migrant workers in the 4 panchayats and a municipality in Ernakulam District.

In response to COVID-19 pandemic, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Rajagiri outREACH conducted awareness classes through mike announcements, telecommunication, social media, creative tasks activities, site visits & house visits during lockdown period. To reach out to the Migrants Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Staff, created different methods of awareness sessions by reaching out to their resident locality through mike announcements in Hindi and Bengali, working site visits, home visits, etc. 14980 migrants had benefitted from the awareness programs conducted by Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project.



TELEPHONIC COUNSELLING

Many workers are confronting this mix of panic and anxiety, fuelled by half-truths and fantasy. In this context, under the leadership of Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Perumbavoor, outreach workers and Peer Leaders in four panchayats and one municipality in Ernakulam district conducted regular tele counselling for the guest workers.

During the lockdown period the migrants faced different issues such as severe anxiety, their jobless situation and basic needs such as food, shelter, anxiety about COVID-19 infection, return back to their home state, etc. Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Staff supported **950 migrants**

to get rid of their anxiety about COVID–19, fear of losing job, food and safe accommodation of Guest Workers / migrants through Telephonic counselling with DISHA - the toll free number of Health Department, Government of Kerala, to assist the migrants. Based on the migrant's need received through telecounselling, Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Staff linked the migrants with the concerned labour department, local self Governments, health department to reduce their anxieties and also supported them to get health certificate from the primary health centres for travelling to their home state.

Support Services

PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT PROVIDED BY RAJAGIRI outREACH SURAKSHA MIGRANT STAFF TO THE MIGRANTS

Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Staff had provided Psychosocial support to migrants residing in Ernakulam District and also for the inmates of COVID-19 Shelter home at the girls Highs School, Perumbavoor Municipality with the support of Health, Labour Departments and Perumbavoor Municipality

Migrant workers get affected by the negative emotional conditions and mental stress compared with the non-migrants due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project Perumbavoor had provided Panchayat wise telephonic counselling and home visits to around **2080** beneficiaries for the period from April 2020 to June 2020.



12. Institutional Infrastructure / facility provided by Rajagiri College of Social Sciences to authorities to combat COVID-19

COVID WARRIORS

2020 presented the world with a jolt out of the blue - COVID-19! The widespread outbreak of the pandemic in March 2020 caused great panic and left even the developed nations clueless and off-guard. As death tolls peaked in Italy, China and, the U.S., the cautious and concentrated efforts of the COVID warriors in Kerala performed miracles.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), run by the CMI Fathers, stepped forward in this moment of crisis as always, joining hands with the government bodies to serve the societal cause.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences Boys' Hostel (Assumption Hostel) was converted to COVID-19 Care Centre Short Stay Home and Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI, Assistant Director of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, was appointed as the Management Coordinator, vide order No.A1-20/20 Dated 29.04.2020 issued by Mr. Snehil Kumar Singh IAS, Incident Commander and Sub Divisional Magistrate. Later the COVID Short Stay Home was converted to First Line Treatment Centre (FLTC). A total of 70 single rooms with attached bathrooms were available at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences' COVID-19 First Line Treatment Centre. Apart from infrastructure facilities, electricity, water and free security were provided. The boys' hostel block of the Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was thus set aside for 8 months free of cost for COVID-19 relief activities.

Initially, it began functioning as the COVID-19 Care Centre Short Stay Home and later on converted to First Line Treatment Centre (FLTC) in Ernakulam district, nursing about 1200 people who were quarantined and 1907 COVID-19 positive cases were treated at the FLTC at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences with the support of Health Department, Kalamassery Municipality and District Administration, Ernakulam. The objective of the short stay home is to keep the people in quarantine and also to provide facilities to ensure that the chance of spread can be contained. Rajagiri outREACH Staff had supported in the arrangement of infrastructure facilities at the FLTC.

It is the collective effort of 32 health workers that has helped to treat and cure so many COVID-19 victims ranging from 7 days to 95 years old. It is the heroic intervention of the medical staff under the leadership of Dr. Cyril G. Cherian, Medical Officer in charge, Dr. Shaheer Backer, Asst. Nodal Officer, Dr. Nithin R., Dr. Ashley Joseph (Medical Officers) that made this a historic landmark. We, at Rajagiri, salute all our COVID warriors for their selfless service toward the wellbeing of our society.


Also took part in state level and district level meetings through video conferencing to discuss about various activities for children that could be done during the lockdown period to ensure the safety and wellbeing of each child.









18. COVID-19 Relief Activities for the Elderly

The Day Care Centre for the Elderly, is a non-institutional scheme namely Pakalveedu for the elderly, mainly functioning in Ernakulam District at Kothad, Kadamakkudy and Binanipuram. "Pakalveedukal" are functioning under the patronage of various Corporates, LSG"s, clubs, organizations, etc. The emphasis is on non-institutional and Community Based Services (CBS) with the intention of integrating the elderly with the community. The purpose and basic principle of the approach is to assist the elderly who experience isolation, rejection and suffer from insecurity, anxiety and depression. The programme supports 350 elderly people through different centers.

Our first Senior Citizen Day Care Center (Pakalveedu) was established in Kothad Village in Ernakulam District in the year 1997.

During the COVID-19 pandemic period the Elderly Day Care Centres could not function as per the COVID-19 protocol of safety measures, hence Rajagiri outREACH had distributed food and health kits, nutrition kits, masks, awareness sessions, Telecounselling, psycho social support, etc., to the Beneficiaries of Rajagiri outREACH Senior Citizen Day Care Centres.






